


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### **OUR TERRITORIES FACE A CLIMATE EMERGENCY**

## **RECOMMENDATIONS FOR LOCAL-LED IMPLEMENTATION OF** THE PARIS AGREEMENT

CEMR's key messages presented at the November 2021 COP26 climate summit in Glasgow:

- Obliver the Paris Agreement now! Covering mitigation and adaptation at all levels
- ✓ Local and regional leadership and action can strengthen work at international level
- Appropriate regulatory frameworks, financial and technical resources are essential to enable Local and Regional Governments' climate action
- The SDGs need to be localised and territorialised
- Climate justice and social equity need to go hand in hand
- Focus on resilience and recovery beyond the pandemic crisis
